- 3.) Five wooden hangers (which can't be bought here for love nor money.)
- 4.) Some salt tablets.

I hate to bother you with these things but I just can't get them and if possible would like to have them. Thanks loads, in advance.

While on the subject of sending things, I wonder what's happened to my subscriptions of Life, the Williams Record, and Deerfield Scroll. If they're coming to 375, I'd appreciate your forwarding them.

Haven't any more news since last night so I'll hang up now. Thanks for all my various requests, and I hope they're not too much trouble.
