Flying 3:00 - 7:00

Dinner 7:30

Flying 8:30 - 10:30

Ground School 11:00 - 2:00

P.T. 2:00 - 3:00

Supper 4:00

Taps & To bed 6:00

If that isn't the worst schedule you've ever heard of getting up at 1:30 and going to bed at 6:00 in the evening. We have to have these terrible hours so that we can get all our bombs dropped before the 23rd. The bad weather got us way behind on our night bombs. Just wanted you to know what's what
