Dear Dad & Bee —

We just left Des Moines on our way west on what has been a very smooth and uneventful trip. Only slept a few winks during the night but I don't feel too worse for wares as yet. I'll probably be dead tired by this afternoon.

I can't begin to adequately tell you how much I enjoyed my 10 short days at home. Although I didn't do much in the way of excitement, it was wonderful to see you, Jimmy, and Pam again. Eating good meals and just taking it easy made for my best vacation ever. Both of you were just swell about everything and made my stay a real pleasure and much needed change. My only regret is that it couldn't have lasted much longer. I guess you never really appreciate home and a million and one little things you've always taken for granted until you've been away for awhile — it sure does the trick.
