Dear Dad & Bee —

I haven't much in the way of news but even so a few lines are in order to say that all goes well. Still on word as to when I'll be crewed up and be shipped out.

Just like all good things our pleasant set-up came to an abrupt end on monday. Everybody is now required to be on the post every night by one o'clock at night. They have us going to school every day from eight in the morning until five. It's horribly confused and at best, a complete farce. We don't get a darn thing out of school and so it's a complete waste of time. They make us go just to keep our day occupied. Frankly I'd rather sleep.

Comes five o'clock and we all head for town to indulge in a good meal and perhaps a movie or some such entertainment. Don't remember if I told you or not, but last Saturday we saw the Utah-Colorado football game. Not a good fame, but lots of fun.

No more news now. Will write as soon as I find out about being moved out, etc.
