Dear Dad & Bee —

Just a note to say that all goes well and thanks alot for your letters. I received the ring and pictures, both of which were gladly received. I returned the proofs this afternoon, so you should get them in the middle of next week.

I agreed with you on the one you selected but I didn't think that any of them were too wonderful. I guess I have no complaints, considering the subject. I would appreciate it if you'd order me one, *[inserted: print]* along with yours. When you get it, you can send it on to me and I'll pay you for it. Incidentally I owe you *[inserted: \$]* 3.00 for my ring which is enclosed.

All hell broke loose around here when the Colonel restricted us to our area for two days. If all goes well, we ought to get out again tomorrow — I sure hope so cause this place is a real dump. Still nothing definite about shipping although something may come up in a day or so. I'll let you know as soon as I hear anything myself.
