Wednesday 23rd

Dear Dad & Bee —

Haven't anything particular to write but I thought a letter was in order to say that all goes well with R.L.S. I'm up and around in good shape now and ought to be off my crutches before long. I have treatments and exercises at physio-therapy twice a day and my leg is coming along just fine. I can still only flex it about 90° but that takes a little time to get full use of it again. In a few days the doctor said I could have a pass to get out of the hospital for a few hours. It will be a pleasure to get out after being cooped up for a month.

Speaking of slow mail service I got a letter from both of you and from Pam today and all of them were

postmarked the 8th. From the 8th to the 23rd is mighty poor service. Thanks loads for the cute valentines that arrived this morning. You might think we were in the days of the pony-express. No more for now except that everything is just fine here. Write often.
