Dear Dad & Bee —

Very little to report from this part of the world except that R.L.S. is well on the way to leaving the hospital. Two days ago I was over at the club on pass and believe me it was good to leave the hospital for a few hours. Of course I was quite weak but that's to be expected, I guess.

Before I forget, Dad, I'm wondering if your office is going to take care of my income tax report etc. as they did it last year. I've done nothing about it as yet and so I'd appreciate an immediate answer so I can get to work if I have to do it. It would be swell if they'd handle it for me. Since Oct 23rd 1943 my income has been

Base Pay \$150 Flying Pay \$75 Rental \$45 Subsistence \$21

= \$291

Of course the \$45 is taken out of my pay and I pay \$6.60 a month for insurance.

Please be sure to let me know about this as soon as possible.

Can't think of anymore for now. Write often.
