Perhaps I can get a line through some time this week.

I received a long letter from Don today telling of his new set-up etc. I think his change-over is a good break and I only hope he can stick with it [strikeout] for a while and not get shifted to another outfit before he even has

a chance to get started. He has certainly done the rounds during his short time in the army. No more for now cause I wrote all the news in my long letter yesterday — just wanted you to know that it was I who called, so you wouldn't worry.
