Dear Dad & Bee —

Just a note to say 'twas swell to talk to you yesterday. Had a disappointment when I couldn't get through to talk to Don. I did however, speak to Jim who was swell as ever.

Had a fine time cooking hamburgers etc. over a fire yesterday. 'Twas such fun to go on a picnic again. Played bridge last night.

This morning I did alot of errands in Beverly Hills while Ronnie was doing nursing. She'll be back in a little while. Tonight I'm going to take the Drakes out for a steak dinner and then return to March later.

As I said on the phone please

continue to write to Box 1416 and it will be forwarded. As soon as I get an A.P.O number I'll sent [*sic*] it to you.

If I have a chance to write or call from Frisco I will but if not please don't worry about me. I have no idea how long I'll be there or how busy I'll be so don't expect to hear from — if I possibly can I'll contact you.
