Dear Folks —

Have time for a few lines to say that everything is fine with R. L. S. At the moment we are attending the 7th Air Force Gunnery School. It's a darn good course of ground school, range, and flying that lasts about a month. We go to school for the first two weeks from 7:45 until 5:00 with only an hour out for lunch. Ten classes a day is really alot, particularly when it's as hot as it is here. The classes aren't too interesting but they are most essential. The school is good cheap life insurance.

Last Sunday we had an outing to Honolulu to see the 7th AAF ball team play. When we left after two and a half innings the score was 15-1. The fliers have Joe DiMag, Joe Gordon, and a number of other big time ball players — they're just like a pro team.

My mail has been bawled up since we moved but I hope it will straighten out in a day or so. Continue to write to APO 953 and I'll get my mail eventually. Write often.
