Dear Dad & Bee —

Our first week of classes [*strikeout*] is over and today is our day-off, and so we're down here on the beach enjoying a little sun and relaxation. As I look out on the beach it's hard to believe that there's a war on — there are people swimming, surf-boarding, and sailing.

This is really a lovely officers club located on the beach just beyond the Royal Hawaiian. They have swimming and sunbathing facilities, a writing room, and an attractive snack bar. There's a college register book here and I ran across several boys name's that I knew. Harvey Daniels' name was under the Dartmouth group.

Many thanks for your long newsy letter, Bee. It's one of the first I received with my new APO address. Haven't heard from Dad for awhile but I guess that's because he's still fishing. Our mail service here is terrible.
