Dear All —

Since my last letter I've been quite well occupied with a big dose of flying. We flew down to Johnston Island and to Midway. The former was a flight of over eleven hours. Believe me that's a long time to be up in a B-24, which was not designed for comfort. Both missions were mainly for the navigator, although we did drop a few bombs on the way back. The navigator really did a swell job and got us through in fine shape.

Many thanks for all your various letters — it's certainly great to hear from you often. Please keep your pens at work because it's your letters that keep the old morale from hitting rock bottom. You surely are a regular Walter Winchell, Bee. I was kinda surprised to hear about Delia's engagement. Was glad to receive the letters from both of the Jacks. I intend to write them if I can ever find a minute or two.

As yet I haven't had a chance to see Mr. Kellet, Dad, although I intend to if I ever get back to town before we leave. From now on we'll be fairly busy flying, I imagine.

The mosquitos are driving me mad so I'll have to stop now. Just about sundown they

come out in squadrons and really go after us.

S'long to you all for now — I'll try to find something of interest to write at the beginning of the week.
