Just a line or two to tell you how swell it was to talk to you the other day. You can well imagine how wonderful it is to be out of the combat zone and back here where people live like human beings. It will still be a little while before we leave for the States so don't count the days. It seems that everyone goes home by boat now so that will take a little time too.

Had a big old brawl the other night on the money you sent me, Dad. Believe me it was a mighty wet party and one we'd looked forward to for a long time. Again a million thanks for treating us, Dad. I only wish you could have been along.

At the moment we're living at the rest camp devouring lots of fresh food and gallons of milk. It's a real pleasure to eat good food once again.

Have been swimming several times and in general have been taking it very easy just enjoying the conveniences of civilization.
