Sec'y – to put their heads together to plan how to kill the enemy in Nebraska this November 7th next and she wants to stop over with you a train – if there is the slightest hope of your helping her to get any ammunition for the war — We must raise \$10,000 – soon – to fight this battle – and it looks as if we might win in Nebraska if we [2] if the rich women will [*ever*] help us to bring our guns to bear on their <u>arch enemy</u> – ignorance & prejudice – that is sustain us in [*inserted:* carrying] lecturers & tracts into every school district
