"Music and You" Questionnaire: The "Empathy Hook" Teacher's Copy

Objective / For the Teacher:

The following handout is designed to help students better understand what they appreciate about their favorite music, and the impact it has on their daily lives, so that they may empathize with those Americans in the 1940s who not only loved jazz and swing, but used it as a vehicle for morale and hope.
