<b>Preparation</b>	Unable to locate factual evidence in the text with a page number	Locates evidence in support of an idea under discussion	Uses evidence in the text to expand on, analyze, or critique an idea	Uses evidence in the text to create a new idea or draw connections among ideas
<b>Participation</b>	Speaks off topic, shows uninvolved attitude, offers opinions without textual support	Presents unexplained ideas, becomes involved sporadically, or only when called upon	Contributes to the conversation, both when called upon and on his/her own accord	Frequently contributes meaningfully to the discussion
<b>Sharing</b>	Interrupts others while they are talking, ignores others and the process	Makes tangential remarks, actively listening but not adding to the conversation	Attempts to explain ideas, may initiate a new ide	Explains ideas clearly, initiates new ideas, includes others through verbal exchange
<b>Supporting</b>	Attempts to obstruct the Socratic process	Not able to build upon another student's statement	Occasionally refers to another's point	Builds on another's point explains ideas thoroughly, makes references to points made by other students
