William Rabun, Governor of the State of Georgia.

> Department of State, Washington 30. June 1818

Sir,

The President of the United States has directed that Captain Obed Wright should be prosecuted for the murder of friendly Indians before a special Commission, to be issued conformably to the 15th section of the act of Congress of 30. March 1802 – to regulate trade and intercourse with the Indian tribes and to preserve peace on the frontiers. Instructions to that effect will be immediately forwarded to the Attorney of the United States – But as from the expressions of the Law the Commission cannot issue until the accused shall have been legally apprehended by the Civil authority of the United States, I have to request [2] request your Excellency that Captain Wright may be released from his arrest by your Excellency's order, in such manner, that he may pass immediately into the Custody of the Marshal.
